ON THE COVER: This detail comes from the profoundly disquieting and beautiful drawing that artist, Alice Leora Briggs, created by using an ancient etching technique called *sgaffito*. It is one of many in *Dreamland*, a book she created with writer, Charles Bowden. The book documents the surreality of Ciudad Juarez, a city where drug cartels inflict murderous atrocities on a daily basis that neither the citizens nor the government acknowledge. Briggs has exhibited her drawings and architectural installations in museums, galleries, and nonprofit spaces across the United States and in Europe.
